# Teacher Reports

#### **Lead Teachers**

#### K Reddick

Unit 4 – talking about what we can learn from family traditions, what life was like in the past. 90 kindergarten sight words and we have done 66 of them. Working on long I pattern. About to add the sentence to their spelling test. Math is dealing with 2D shapes and then will lead into 3D shapes. Social Studies, started night and day.... What you see in the day and what you see at night. Science will end up in space and plants and how they grow and change. They will also be going to the Challenger Learning Center also. Showed some kindergarten projects, it is interesting to see how they think. Right now, based on their projects, they are equating night and day with food.

#### 1 – Sellars

Money, measurement, and time in math. Which ties into social studies needs and wants and goods and services. In science they just finished water safety and now starting sun safety and space. Field trip to Challenger is coming soon to wrap that unit up. About to start the Fairy Tale Unit.

## 2 – Fuqua
